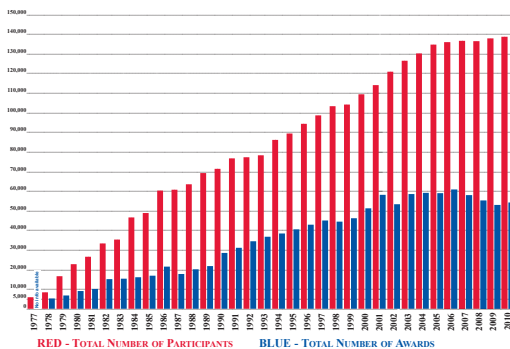

ACL/NJCL NATIONAL LATIN EXAM

HISTORY AND INTRODUCTION

- ♦ Originated in 1977
 - Nearly 6,000 students participated
- ♦ NLE Statistics for 2010:
 - Over 138,000 students participated
 - Over 53,000 awards given
 - All 50 states and 13 foreign countries participated
- ♦ Sponsored by the American Classical League and the National Junior Classical League
- ♦ Approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals and placed on The Advisory List of National Contests and Activities for 2010-2011

PURPOSE

- ♦ To promote Latin and the study of the Classics

ELIGIBILITY

- ♦ Open to all students enrolled in Latin during the current academic year

EXAMINATIONS AVAILABLE

- ♦ Introduction to Latin ♦ Latin I ♦ Latin II
- ♦ Latin III ♦ Latin III-IV Prose
- ♦ Latin III-IV Poetry ♦ Latin V-VI

FORMAT AND CONTENT

- ♦ 40 multiple choice questions
- ♦ Levels Intro - Latin IV include: grammar, comprehension, mythology, life, history, and derivatives, as well as questions based on a short passage.
- ♦ Latin V-VI includes: one prose and one poetry passage with questions on comprehension, grammar, historical background, classical literature, and literary devices.
- ♦ Exams not based on any specific textbook series
- ♦ Previous exams and Syllabi available on NLE website or from the American Classical League

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

TO ENTER

- ♦ **Teacher** fills out application form completely
- ♦ Mail in top copy (BLUE) to NLE office
- ♦ Keep yellow copy for your records
- ♦ Enclose **ONE** check or money order payable to the National Latin Exam
- ♦ NLE sends Teacher postcard verifying receipt of application and payment

DEADLINES

- ♦ Regular Postmark Deadline:
JANUARY 18, 2011

ADMINISTRATION OF EXAMS

EXAM DATES

- ♦ **FEBRUARY 28 - MARCH 4, 2011**
(1st week of Early Administration)
- ♦ **MARCH 7 - MARCH 11, 2011**
(2nd week of Early Administration)
- ♦ **MARCH 14 - MARCH 18, 2011**
(Regular week of Administration)

WHO CAN ADMINISTER EXAM

- ♦ **Principal**
- ♦ **Guidance Director**
- ♦ **Designee from Teacher or Principal**
**EXAM IS NOT TO BE SEEN OR
GIVEN BY THE LATIN TEACHER**

EXAM LEVEL

STUDENT SHOULD TAKE

- ♦ Student must take the level in which he/she is currently enrolled at the time of the exam.
- ♦ Student may only take ONE level of the exam
- ♦ Use syllabus for guidelines (i.e., for independent study or home schools)

DAY OF EXAM

- ♦ **ALL STUDENTS OF THE SAME LEVEL** must take the exam during the same time period. **No make-up exams are allowed after the fact.**
- ♦ Administrator should try to seat students of the same level apart from one another
- ♦ Time limit is 45 minutes
(*Please call ahead for students with special needs or for scheduling issues.*)
- ♦ When exam is over, Administrator should count completed answer sheets, and check test materials for any missing answer sheets
- ♦ **Answer sheets must be returned and postmarked the same day exam is given**
- ♦ No answer sheets mailed separately from school's package will be accepted without prior permission
- ♦ Last Day exam may be taken and answer sheets returned is: **MARCH 18, 2011**

AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

AWARDS PACKAGE

Package mailed to Latin Teacher by April 20 includes:

- ♦ Awards
- ♦ Certificate of school participation
- ♦ Print-out of student scores
- ♦ National norms
- ♦ Answer keys for all exams

TYPES OF AWARDS

INTRODUCTION TO LATIN EXAM:

- ♦ Ribbons and certificates of achievement

LATIN I - VI EXAMS:

- ♦ Hand-lettered certificates for perfect papers
- ♦ Gold medals and summa cum laude certificates for top scorers
- ♦ Silver medals and maxima cum laude certificates for second-place winners
- ♦ Magna cum laude certificates for third-place winners
- ♦ Cum laude certificates for fourth-place winners

SPECIAL AWARDS

- ♦ **Maureen O'Donnell Award**
(Oxford Classical Dictionary)
awarded to students who earn four gold medals
- ♦ **Carter Stubbs Drake Goad Award**
(a book award)
awarded to students who earn three or more perfect papers, or five or more gold medals

SCHOLARSHIPS

- ♦ **Twenty-one \$1,000 scholarships**
- ♦ Applications are available online only to seniors who are gold medal winners in Latin III, Latin III-IV Prose, Latin III-IV Poetry, or Latin V-VI
- ♦ Applicants agree to take at least one year of Latin or classical Greek in college
- ♦ These scholarships are renewable for three succeeding college years of study
- ♦ **One \$2,000 scholarship for post-graduate study**
(leading to the teaching of Latin or Greek at the elementary, intermediate, or high school level)
- ♦ Scholarship winners are announced at the ACL Convention in June 2011
